Homework

Pupils will have a family reading homework Monday to Thursday evenings each week. They will have one sound homework to complete each week. They will be learning their tricky words continuously as required.

There is written homework Monday

night for literacy and a numeracy homework on Wednesday night.

ICT

Your child will have access to iPads, cameras, computers and interactive whiteboards to support their learning throughout the year. ICT suite access will be restricted due to Covid-19. Pupils will still have cross curricular ICT and iPad learning in the classroom. **Topic work in Year 1**

In school we study the World Around Us (WAU) in each year group. Pupils in Year 1 will develop their WAU scientific, geographical and historical knowledge in 5 topics areas during the year, namely: Ourselves, Fairy tales. Polar Lands. New life and Mini beasts.

Please read and discuss aspects of these topic areas at every opportunity at home.

Pupils will also work on their Thinking Skills and

Personal Capabilities (TSPC) throughout their topic work including: Working with Others, Being Creative, Managing Information, Problem Solving/Decision making and Self-Management. Again please encourage opportunities for your child to develop these skills at home as well. Ask your teacher for ideas if needed. CHILD CENTRED PROVISION

Counting forward to 20 and backwards from 20

Counting in 1s and 2s to 20.

Number before, after, between within 20 Addition / Subtraction

Ordering numbers

Number bonds in up to 5 (e.g. 2 and ? = 5)

Understand oral problem solving Money—adding and making amounts using 1p, 2p, 5p, coins



Data Handling

Measure

Using tree, Carroll and Venn diagrams for sorting (Google them if unsure!)

Block graphs and pictographs for representing information

Know days of the week in order Know o'clock and half past times Understand length, weight and capacity

Shape and Space

Know names and recognise 2D and 3D shapes square, rectangle, circle, triangle, hexagon, pentagon — cube, cuboid, cylinder, cone.

Understand positional words forwards, backwards, up, down, beside, between...



Literacy

There are lots of reading, writing,

and phonics activities to get through in Y1 and this work will also need your on-going support. **Phonics**

In Year 1 we focus on Jolly phonics. A sound homework will be sent home each week to practise the sound.

Reading

In Year 1 we start reading in November

A word wallet will be sent home with tricky words that do not follow the sound patterns that need to be learnt using the 'look and say' approach.

Pupils need to read daily. We have silent reading time in school each day and guided reading activities with the class teacher. Family readers will be sent home each week to actively encourage reading at home.

Writing, punctuation and grammar

We will be concentrating on correct formation of lower case letters and writing their name independently. We will use . and ? during writing activities.
