We have talked to the nursery children that they should have an adult with them when using a device. This adult can help them if something unusual happens.


<u>Book Fair</u> 10-13th February

Helping your child

- Talk about the size of objects.

- Play games that require turn taking.
- Do jigsaw puzzles. (20+ pieces).
